WINTER WEATHER WOES

When it comes to predicting snow, we know about as much as a groundhog. The only certainty is that winter will be with us for at least another month, which means snow is always possible. In the event of snow or ice, please make sure we are here before you brave the roads and find a closed Library. There are several ways to check for closings and delayed openings:

Call us at 201-391-5090. We are currently unable to set an emergency closing notice for the telephone, so if you hear our regular off-hours message when we're normally open or if the phone just rings and there is no answer, assume that we have closed due to hazardous conditions or other emergency.

Check the Library's Activity Calendar. Just visit the Library's website at *montvalelibrarynj.org* and click on the bar for "Activity Calendar." Check the current date to see if we're open or closed.

Join the Library's listserv. Listserv members automatically receive announcements via email regarding Library closings. To sign up, email *nayda.rondon@montvale.bccls.org* and ask to join the listserv.

Go to bccls.org. Click on the link at the top of the page entitled "Emergency Closings" to learn the status of our library as well as other BCCLS libraries.

MONTVALE LOVES MUSEUMS

Spice up your February or spring staycation with a visit to a museum, courtesy of the Friends of the Montvale Library. The Friends have generously arranged for Montvale residents to visit the Intrepid and the Museum of Natural History for free and the Liberty Science Center at a discounted rate.

To visit the **Intrepid**, you must arrange to borrow the Library's museum pass. The pass provides general admission for six people to the Intrepid Museum, the Space Shuttle Pavilion, and the submarine Growler. It does not include member events, programs, or simulators. Please read the detailed instructions regarding this pass at *montvalelibrarynj.org/intrepid.html* prior to reserving it.

Vouchers for the **Museum of Natural History** are distributed at the Reference Desk. Each voucher admits one person and can be redeemed for free general admission and one special exhibition, film, or live animal exhibition of the visitor's choosing. The Liberty Science Center offers a \$3.00 discount to Montvale residents. Simply present your Montvale Library card at the box office when you purchase your tickets. AN UPDATE ON THE DELIVERY SYSTEM

You will now need to sign on with a password, but it's an easy one--montvale (all lower case)!

World Thinking Day is Thursday, February 22 at 3:30. Registration is open and limited to 25 girls in first grade and up. This event will be hosted by the Montvale Girl Scouts.

Pysanky Egg Decorating Workshop is Friday, March 9th at 3:30 for children in kindergarten and up. Registration starts February 19th and requires a non-refundable and cash only materials fee of \$10.

Dog Biscuit Making is Thursday, March 15th at 3:30 for children in second grade and up. Register starting February 26th.

Garden Arts is Tuesday, April 17th at 3:45 for ages four and up. Registration begins April 2nd.

Art Workshop with Mom or Grandma will be Wednesday, May 9th at 7:00 p.m. for children in first grade and up. Registration opens April 23rd.

Night Time Story Hour is always the last Wednesday of the month at 6:30 for children ages 3 – 6.

Art Club with Artist Peri is held the third Thursday of the month unless noted otherwise. Children in 2nd grade and up may register prior to the program.

Spring Story Hour starts the week of April 9th and runs for eight weeks. Montvale residents may register with a valid Montvale library card starting March 12th.

OFFERINGS FOR ADULTS

PYSANKY WITH PATTY!

A sure sign of spring's arrival is the announcement of Montvale Library's annual pysanky workshop. This year, expert Patty Wiszuk-DeAngelo will offer a three hour workshop for adults and teens (13 and up) on Saturday, March 10th from 12:30 – 3:30 p.m. in the Library's children's activity room. Participants will learn the traditional folk art of Ukrainian pysanky (egg decorating). All attendees will enjoy personal hands-on instruction in the traditional egg dyeing process. Ms. Wiszuk-DeAngelo will explain how to draw designs on eggs and how to use the kistka (a small wooden dowel utilized in the egg-decorating process). She will demonstrate waxing and dyeing techniques and provide an overview on the history of this 4,000-year-old Ukrainian folk art.

In-person registration begins Thursday, February 15th at 10 a.m. and is limited to 20 participants. At this time, registrants will be required to pay a \$25 cash and non-refundable fee for a comprehensive materials kit. Note: You may sign up ONLY for yourself.

LEARN OR TEACH ENGLISH AT THE MONTVALE LIBRARY

The Montvale Library offers free English as a Second Language tutoring to foreign-born adult Montvale residents. Tutoring is on a one-to-one basis once a week in the quiet rooms at the Library. ESL students of all abilities are welcome—from beginners to advanced speakers. To get started, fill out an application at the Circulation desk the next time you visit the Library. We will add you to our waiting list and contact you as soon as a tutor becomes available.

If you are interested in becoming an ESL tutor, you may enroll in a free ESL tutor training workshop offered at the Westwood library. Workshops are held several times a year and usually consist of four sessions. Upon completing the workshop, we will match you with an ESL student with a compatible schedule.
